To the Commissioners:

The National Republican Senatorial Committee (NRSC) submits this correspondence to seek guidance and clarification from the Federal Election Commission (FEC) regarding the appropriate methodology for measuring, quantifying, and reporting non-monetary, in-kind contributions under the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA), 52 U.S.C. § 30101 *et seq.*, to the NRSC from Hasan Piker.

Specifically, the NRSC requests clarification regarding how to properly quantify the value of Twitch streamer Hasan Piker's commentary that reaches an audience of millions across various digital platforms.

Piker's public record includes several highly contentious statements that serve as focal points in ongoing political debates:

- Declared that "America deserved 9/11."
- Asserted that "pound for pound" America is worse than Al-Qaeda.
- Argued that Iran deserves a nuclear weapon and that the Middle East would be more stable with an Iranian nuclear deterrent.
- Stated that American Jews supporting Israel are inciting violence.
- Compared Israelis to hate groups such as the Ku Klux Klan.

In addition to these inflammatory comments, Piker has actively backed and promoted several high-profile Democratic Senate candidates across the country who are running against candidates supported by the NRSC, including **Abdul El-Sayed** in Michigan, **Troy Jackson** in Maine, **Peggy Flanagan** in Minnesota, and **James Talarico** in Texas.

His direct campaign activities, joint streaming events, and endorsements are invaluable to the NRSC's mission of electing more Republicans and highlighting the extreme agenda of the Democratic Party. Accordingly, the NRSC requests guidance from the Commission on how to accurately report these in-kind contributions to the Republican Party.
